The population of Highley Electoral Division is broken down as follows:








The population of Highley Electoral Division changed by 9.5 % between 2011 and 2022. Population growth has been higher than the Shropshire average of 6.6% since 2011.

The percentage of the population of traditional working age (16-64) is 56.1%. This is lower than the Shropshire average which stands at 58.4%.

The proportion of the population which is aged 65 and above is 26.8%. This is higher than in Shropshire (25.8%).



Breakdown of Population by Age and Gender (2022): Highley Electoral Division



Breakdown of Population by Religion: Highley Electoral Division




In Highley Electoral Division 56.7 % of the population describe themselves as Christian. This compares with 55.5% in Shropshire and 46.3% in England.

35.6 % claim to have no religion (37.0% Shropshire and 36.7% England).

At the time of the Census the proportion of the population that followed all other religions stood at 1.4% in Highley Electoral Division.

Breakdown of Population by Ethnic Group: Highley **Electoral Division**




97.8 % of the population in Highley Electoral Division describe themselves as white. This compares with 96.7% of the Shropshire population and 81.0% of the population in England.

0.0 % of the population describe themselves as Black, Black British, Black Welsh, Caribbean or African. This compares with 0.3% in Shropshire and 4.2% in England.

1.0 % of the population describe themselves as Asian, Asian British or Asian Welsh (1.3% Shropshire and 9.6% England).

0.7 % describe themselves as Mixed or Multiple ethnic groups (1.2% Shropshire and 3.0% England).

Main Household Language: Highley Electoral Division



The vast majority of Highley Electoral Division households comprise all adults for whom the main language is English (99.0 % compared with 97.1% in Shropshire and 89.3% in England).


There are 5 households where no people in the household have English as their main language, and a further 3 households where there are no adults with English as their main language, but at least one 3-15 year old who does have English as their main language.

Proportion of the Population that is Disabled according to the Equalities Act: Highley Electoral Division





In **Highley Electoral Division 833** people are disabled according to the Equalities Act. This equates with **20.0** % of the population.

This proportion is higher than the Shropshire figure of 18.5%.

The England rate stands at 17.3%.

Of the residents that have a disability (under the Equalities Act), **345** say that their activities are limited a lot.

In **Highley Electoral Division 7.1** % of the population are not disabled, but have a long term physical or mental health condition which does not limit their day-to-day activities.

In **Highley Electoral Division 6.2%** of the population claim to have bad or very health.

This is higher than the Shropshire figure of 5.1%. The England percentage is similar to Shropshire's at 5.2%.

The proportion of the population saying they have good or very good health is **78.7**%.

This is lower than the Shropshire figure of 81.3%. The proportion in England is 82.2%.

In **Highley Electoral Division 415** residents aged 5 years old and above provided some unpaid care for a family member, friend or relative. This is the equivalent of **10.5%** of the population (aged 5 years and above). This compares with 9.6% in Shropshire and 8.8% in England.


The majority of unpaid carers provide up to 19 hours of care per week. However, in **Highley Electoral Division** there are **132 people** who provided 50 or more hours unpaid care. This represents **3.4%** of the population.






All Households; Breakdown by Compostion: Highley Electoral Division




Single Family Households: Highley Electoral Division

The proportion of households in **Highley Electoral Division** with dependent children is **23.3%**. This is similar to the Shropshire average of 23.9%.

The proportion of households with all residents aged 66 and over is **31.1%.** This is higher than the Shropshire average of 29.0%.






Breakdown of Housing by Type: Highley Electoral Division

In **Highley Electoral Division 37.3** % of houses are detached. This compares with 41.0% in Shropshire and 31.5% in England. Detached houses tend to be more common in rural locations.

32.0 % of houses are semi-detached (33.5% in Shropshire and 31.5% in England). 22.9 % of houses are terraced (15.8% in Shropshire and 23.0% in England). 1.6 % of houses are flats in a purpose built block (6.1% in Shropshire and 17.1% in England).

69.0% of homes are owned (44.4% owned outright and 24.7% owned with a mortgage). This is higher than the Shropshire figure of 68.6%. **14.7%** of homes are socially rented. This is higher than the Shropshire figure of 13.0%.

The number of houses with no central heating is 32. This equates with 1.7% of all households. This is higher than the Shropshire average of 1.4%









Number of Cars of Vans by Household: Highley Electoral Division

The rural nature of Shropshire means that car ownership is high. Just 13.8% of all Shropshire households did not have access to a car or van at the time of the 2021 Census. This compares with a national average of 23.5%.

7.3% of the **Highley Electoral Division** population (aged 16 and above) travelled less than 2km to get to work in 2021. This compares with 12.8% in Shropshire and 11% in England. **34.9%** travelled less than 20km (40.0% in Shropshire and 45.7% in England).

24.5% travelled more than 20km compared with 17.4% in Shropshire and 8.3% in England.

In Highley Electoral Division **21.6%** worked mainly from home. This compares with 27.2% in Shropshire and 31.5% in England.


Other locations include off-shore, outside the UK, and no fixed work base.

It should be noted that the 2021 Census took place during the Covid-19 pandemic and this will have impacted on where people were working.






Breakdown between Full and Part-time Jobs, 2023: Highley Electoral Division






There were **360** jobs in **Highley Electoral Division** in 2023. The number of employments, which includes sole traders and working proprietors as well as employees, stood at **370**. The number of jobs increased by **-10** between 2015 and 2024. This equates with growth of **-2.7%**. Across Shropshire, the number of jobs increased by 9.2% between 2015 and 2023.











Highley Electoral Division ranks **33** out of 72 Shropshire Electoral Divisions in terms of deprivation. This places the Electoral Division in the third most deprived quintile of Shropshire according to the overall IMD.

The Indices of Multiple Deprivation 2019 provide a set of relative measures of deprivation for small areas (Lower Level Super Output Areas) across England based on seven main domains of deprivation:

- Income Deprivation (which includes two supplementary indices, Income Deprivation affecting Children and Income Deprivation affecting Older People)
- Employment
- Education (with two sub-domains, Children and Young People and Adults)
